

Correction to Devilly and McFarlane (2009)

In the article, “When Wait Lists Are not Feasible, Nothing Is a Thing That Does not Need to Be Done,” by Grant J. Devilly and Alexander C. McFarlane (*Journal of Consulting and Clinical Psychology*, 2009, Vol. 77, No. 6, pp. 1159–1168),

Sample text:

There is an error in the computation of equation 4 (p. 1165). z does not equal -2.44 as reported but, instead, equals 1.73. We had not divided by the denominator ($\sqrt{2}$). This makes $p(\text{one tailed}) = .042$, not .007 as reported. The interpretation of this computation does not change, although the level of probability does. Rather than being confident that the two studies are from different populations with a p-level of .007, we are still likely to see these studies as having obtained significantly different results but at the probability level of $p < .05$.

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
