Eucalyptus ficifolia and Xanthorrhoea johnsonii



Figure 1: Eucalypts are the most iconic Australian medicinal plants and are possibly the most useful commercially for their medicinal properties (including antimicrobial, insect repellent, pesticidal, anticough and decongestant bioactivities). Eucalyptus is a diverse genus of trees in the family Myrtaceae. Of the more than 700 species that comprise this genus, most are endemic to Australia. A smaller number are also native to New Guinea, Indonesia and the Philippines. Pictured is the red flowering species Eucalyptus ficilolia (also known as Corymbia ficilolia). Figure 2: The genus Xanthorrhoea (Australian grasstrees) is a small genus of slow growing and very long living plants endemic to Australia. The leaves of Xanthorrhoea johnsonii (pictured) have recently been shown to have an anaesthetic effect (Cock and Kalt, 2010) similar to the effects previously described for tubocurarine, dimethyltubocurarine and alcuronium (collectively known as curare, a South American arrow poison) from Chondrodendron tomentosum.
